## **Uniform**

### Consequences

- Our approach is to ensure we listen to pupils and support them to understand how their choices impact on others
- Warnings: "That is 1..." "That is 2..." "That is 3..." = consequence.
- Consequences are personal to the individual child. E.g. missing a part of a playtime.

#### **Immediate 3:**

- Behaviour is recorded and monitored.
- Parents contacted and a senior member of staff notified.
- A consequence is given. Immediate 3 letter sent home. Please discuss this with your child.

## <u>Assessments</u>

- The big one in Year 4 is the times tables test.
- We have three NTS tests (Autumn, Spring, Summer) these contain a reading comprehension paper, maths arithmetic, maths reasoning test.
- We also have some further arithmetic tests throughout the year.
- These are all designed to identify gaps which will help inform our teaching.
   Only the time tables test is reported to the local authority.

## Reading

- Reading is vital!
- Reading activities take place in school daily.
- Books and reading journals must be in school every day.
- Children must read every day. 'Reading challenge' tokens are earned for reading 3 times in a week at home.
- Please make comments in reading journals.

## <u>Homework</u>

- Homework completion is essential.
- Daily reading, weekly times tables, maths sheets, handwriting activity, English basic skills activity.
- Set on a Friday.
- Homework must be returned to school by the following Wednesday.
- Some homework may be set online (Sumdog, TT Rockstars, Purple Mash).
- Please encourage and support your child.
