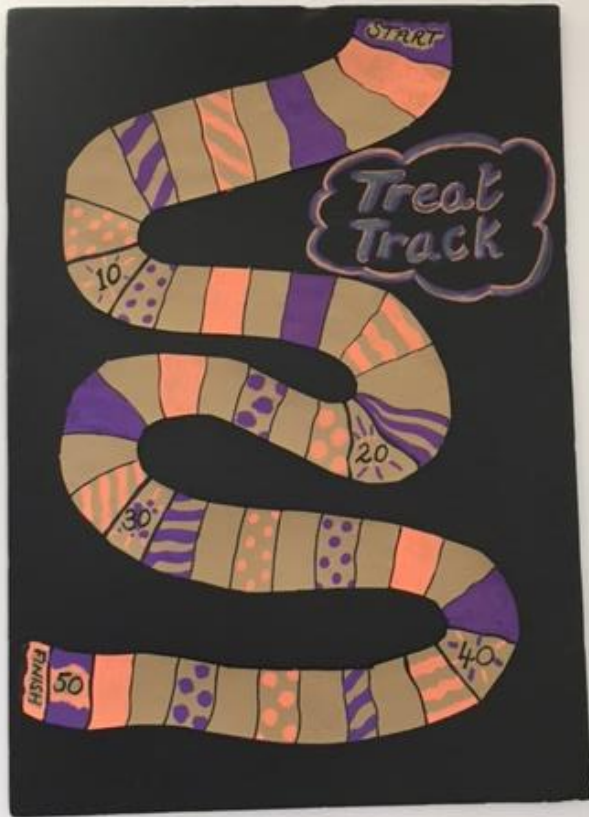
House points, proud cloud, class reward tracks, privileges

Warnings "that is 1, that is 2..."

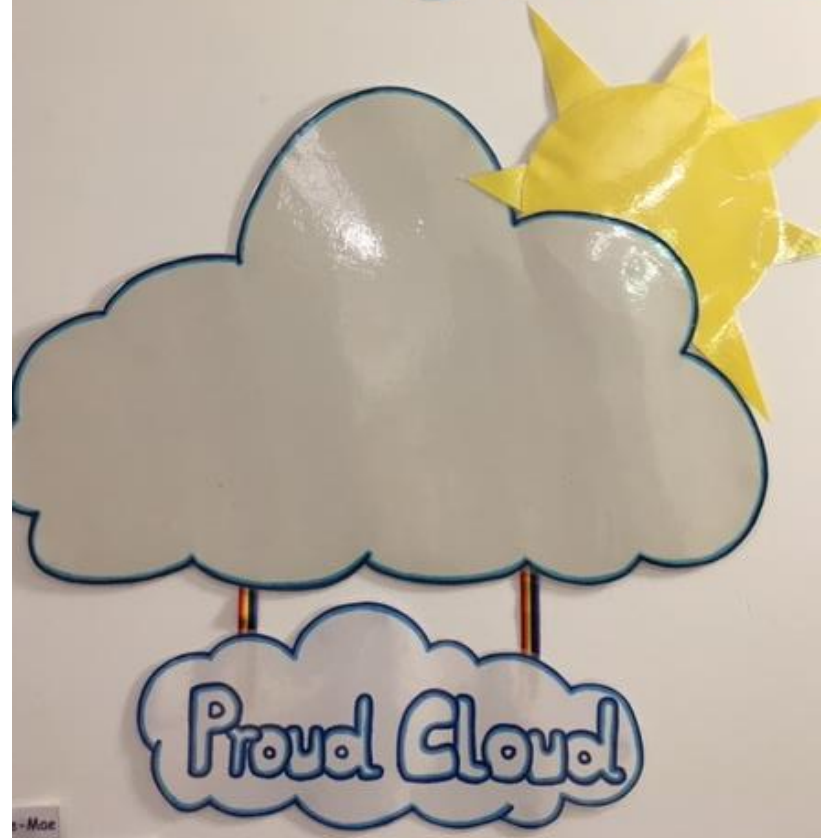
- ❑ "That is 3" = consequence.
- ❑ Consequences are personal to the individual child. E.g. missing a part of a playtime or choosing time.

- ❑ **Immediate 3 (Unacceptable behaviour)**
- ❑ Behaviour is recorded and monitored
- ❑ Parents contacted and a senior member of staff notified.
- ❑ A consequence is given. Immediate 3 letter sent home. Please discuss this with your child. The reply form must be returned to school.

Reading



- ▶ Reading is vital!
- ▶ Reading activities take place in school daily.
- ▶ Books and reading journals must be in school every day
- ▶ Children must read every day. 'Reading challenge' tokens are earned for reading 3 times in a week at home.
- ▶ Please make comments in reading journals.



Homework

- ▶ Homework completion is essential.
- ▶ English and maths and reading - set on a Friday.
- ▶ Some homework may be set online - Spag.com, Sumdog.
- ▶ Homework must be returned to school by the following Wednesday, or your child will need to complete at break in school.
- ▶ Please encourage and support your child.



Homework expectations by year group



Year group	Expectation
Nursery/Reception	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • sharing books/daily reading • learning key words and engaging with a weekly topic related task (often in the form of a speaking and listening activity).
Year 1	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • daily reading. This could also include phonics activity accessed via Ruth Miskin portal. • maths recall sheets • handwriting activity
Year 2	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • daily reading • maths recall sheets • handwriting activity • English basic skills activity
Year 3	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • daily reading • weekly times tables • maths recall sheets • handwriting activity - joining letters. • English basic skills activity – this could be SPAG or reading comprehension based.
Year 4	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • daily reading • weekly times tables • maths recall sheets • handwriting activity - joining letters. • English basic skills activity - this could be SPAG or reading comprehension based.
Year 5	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • daily reading • weekly times tables, where these are not yet secure. • maths recall sheets • English skills activity including a SPAG and a comprehension activity.
Year 6	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • daily reading • maths recall sheets • reading comprehension activity • CGP activity maths • CGP activity spelling, grammar and punctuation
