Our Learners



At Butterfly Meadow, we provide support for young people, aged 7-11. who predominantly have Communication and Interaction needs, specifically ASD (Autism Spectrum Disorder). Some pupils are unable to cope fully with the demands of school. Our goal is to ensure that our pupils can accept and manage their differences in a safe and secure environment, that is more suited to their needs, whilst still having access to the mainstream curriculum.

A key part of our work is educating all pupils within the Hardingstone Academy community so that they understand the complex difficulties experienced daily by those with communication and interaction needs, including Autism.

We will work closely with the Communication & Interaction Support Service. Professionals from this team will support individuals, work with groups and offer advice to teachers and teaching assistants.

Each part of the school site is fully accessible to all pupils, in compliance with the Equality Act 2010. Equality Act 2010: guidance - GOV.UK (www.gov.uk)

Pupils with physical difficulties and disabilities are fully included in all areas of the curriculum.

We work closely with a range of professionals. Professionals from these services will visit school regularly and monitor both the learning and physical access of pupils, offering advice to teachers and teaching assistants.

Teaching assistants play an important part in enabling pupils to access their lessons effectively. Teachers will work closely with teaching assistants to ensure the children's targets are met; barriers are removed so children can access learning (including Mainstream) and the children are provided with a safe, weloming and secure environment.

We ensure that all adults working within Butterfly Meadow have access to regular training to support the developing needs of our children.

Communication and Interaction Needs





The purpose of our curriculum is to enable our children to engage with the world around them. We aim to develop their communication and interaction skills so that they can communicate effectively as confident individuals, stay safe and become responsible citizens. We aim to inspire our pupils and develop their independence to prepare them for the next step on their journey towards fulfilling their aspirations.

Our curriculum is based on a holistic view of the child and is personalised to meet the targets set out in their Education, Health and Care plans (EHCPs). We have organised our curriculum into the following areas : Communication and Language, Personal, Social and Emotional Development, Physical Development, Literacy, Mathematics, Understanding the World and Expressive Arts and Design. Lessons are not necessarily planned as discrete subjects, as they will often incorporate elements of learning from some or all of the areas with developing communication and interaction being at the heart of everything we do. Each half term we have a different topic or theme which will be used as a context for learning activities. We have chosen themes and topics that will broaden the experiences of our children and open up the world around them whilst still being relevant to their stage of development and interest.

Communication is at the heart of everything we do. Each child will have their own personalised communication pathway to enable them to develop their communication skills either verbally or non-verbally. We work closely with Speech and Language service to plan and inform personalised learning for all focused Our curriculum is also informed by The EMAT Curriculum (National Curriculum objectives), Development matters and the EYFS framework.

We recognise that we have a diverse range of needs within our Social Communication Department and therefore our teaching and learning experiences are structured into three pathways. We have called them pathways to reflect that the children are on a journey whilst they are with us. Some children may progress along the same pathway as they move through the school, however others may move onto a different pathway as they progress and develop. All learning is personalised according to each child's specific needs regardless of the pathway they are following. Teaching groups are organised according to stage of development as well as age.



Transition Arrangements

Our transition uses a staggered approach. Once your child has been allocated a place at the Butterfly Hub you will be contacted by the SENco, Miss James

The SENco will observe your child in their current setting.

You will be invited to have a tour of Hardingstone Academy and the Butterfly Hub

You and your child will be invited to have a tour of Hardingstone Academy and the Butterfly Meadow

You and your child will be invited to a 1 hour experience session

Your child will attend a second 1 hour experience session. During this time parents will meet professionals to compile your child's transition plan

Your child will begin a staggered transition into the Butterfly Meadow. During the first week, your child may be part-time. At the end of the first week, this will be reviewed with the aim of your child starting full-time from the second week.





Settling in Sessions

Settling in sessions will help to ensure the transition process for your child is effective in making sure they feel happy, safe and secure in their new environment.

- These settling in sessions will be arranged via a phone call by the SENDCO.
 - Every child will have 2 Settling in Sessions outlined below.



Settling in session 1

This is a one hour session where you will have an opportunity to explore the classroom with your child and to meet the staff.

Settling in session 2

This is a one hour session where your child will explore the classroom alongside the staff and you will attend a meeting with the class teacher and SENCO to discuss the transition process and ask any questions you might have.

What will happen if my child gets lost around school?

Hardingstone Academy is a very friendly place. However, your child will always be monitored by a member of staff. During the transition period, your child will be will be were used to their new environment within Butterfly Meadow. When accessing mainstream, they will be with a key adult from Butterfly Meadow.

Can we contact school if we are worried about anything?

Yes, of course. At Hardingstone Academy, we encourage seeking support, advice or raising concerns with your child's class teacher first. We believe every good teacher is a teacher of SEND. Therefore, your child's class teacher, will be available to talk to. If the class teacher feels they require further support, the SENDCo will be involved to help. The SENDCo would prefer to be alerted before any situation escalates and likes to operate an 'open door' policy.

Who will help my child to make friends?

At Butterfly Meadows, we recognise that our children will have Communication and Interaction needs. This may, but is not limited to, making friends. We will use a variety of social programmes and will encourage daily whole group time, which will be implemented into the timetable. This will be adapted and implemented based on the needs of the class.

Will my child have a TA in all lessons?

A teaching assistant will always be availble within Butterfly Meadow We will encourage your child to complete daily independent tasks. A teaching assistant will also support the children by being in mainstream with the children.
