What makes Hardington Academy special?

Behaviour Hub

Hardington Academy has been selected as a lead school in the Department of Education Behaviour Hubs programme. As a lead school for the region, Hardington Academy has been recognised as having positive behaviour, and so works with other schools to provide them with advice and support to help them to improve their behaviour culture. It is one of just 50 schools in the country to have been selected as a lead school so far.

Lightbulb Award

We are thrilled to have achieved the St Andrew's Mental Health Quality Mark Accreditation. This demonstrates our commitment to the mental health agenda and recognises good practice in this field. We have worked closely with staff from St Andrew's and they have supported us with training for staff and ideas for whole school strategies and practice.



International School Award

International learning is an important part of our curriculum as it enhances our pupils' understanding of other countries and cultures. The school has been presented with the International School award at accreditation level by the British Council. This is awarded to schools which have established a programme of activities around international education and embedded this learning across the school. We are proud to have a strong partnership with Kamtudi School in Kenya. Pupils from each school correspond with each other regularly to learn about their everyday lives and interests.

The School Games Mark

The School Games Mark is a government-led awards scheme to reward schools for their commitment to the development of competition across their school and into the community.' We currently hold silver and are working toward gold.

At Hardingsstone Academy, we are committed to providing a safe and welcoming environment where children are respected and valued. We want every child to enjoy their school experience and create positive memories of their years with us.

Throughout the school, we use Zones of Regulation to enable children to recognise and manage the different emotions they feel. We teach every child to become more aware of and independent in controlling their emotions, a lifelong skill that they will not only be able to transfer to future educational settings but also use in their relationships and situations they encounter outside of school.

In our recent pupil survey, over 90% of our children stated that the school encourages them to look after their physical, emotional and mental health.

What is it like to attend this school?

Pupils are happy and enjoy school. They say that everyone is welcome. New joiners quickly become part of this friendly, inclusive school. Pupils appreciate their caring teachers, who frequently go above and beyond to help them.

Pupils benefit from visits to interesting places to help them learn more. They appreciate opportunities to develop their interests in sport and music. They respect the world around them and fundraise for charities. Pupils in Key Stage 2 relish different responsibilities, such as being a school councillor.

Pupils behave well. They know their school values are important. They are proud to receive praise and awards for being courteous, kind, resilient and doing their best. They say that bullying is rare. Adults help them to resolve any fallouts fairly.
